What inspired the Teen Pantry?

The Teen Pantry was put on our hearts very early on when setting up the Caring Heart Outreach. When I was growing up, I remember the fear of going to school with my classmates on months where we ran out of basic hygiene items. I saw how others who had poor hygiene were treated on a daily basis, so I knew the fear that many of our teens face. So, when trying to decide what products we needed to be able to offer, I just looked back on what I wish I would have had at various times growing up. I did some reading online from other organizations who offer something similar and reached out to their directors, and then I talked with several local teens and families to get their feedback, as well.

Our leadership program will be starting late 2022 or early 2023. We are seeking business and industry leaders in our area willing to invest in our teens that we serve. We want to implement a training program that will instruct and develop skills that will help these teenagers gain skills and build their resumes as they prepare for life after high school.

Why do we incorporate activities for the teens?

Our teens in the Marshall County area don't always have things to do in the surrounding area. Many of them can not afford to do extra curricular activities or either do not have a way to get back and forth to those activities due to numerous practices or performances and parents having to juggle their work schedules. Some teens simply do not have adults in

their lives and are left to fend for themselves in many aspects. So, we wanted to be able to offer some free activities here at the store after hours for them. We get feedback from the teens on what sort of things they want to do. We have had pool parties, scavenger hunts, pizza parties, game night. We get to do fun things like this to engage with them and get to know them so that we can serve them better. We will be hosting a fundraiser dinner the first Friday in December. Make plans to attend to help our Teen Pantry & leadership program.
